

Qualifications to be Considered a QEEG Expert Witness

- 1. A Master's degree or higher in a relevant field, e.g., psychology, neuropsychology, clinical psychology, clinical neuroscience, neurology, psychiatry, etc.
- 2. Licensure is recommended in a relevant field in the State where you reside.
- 3. A minimum of 3 years of experience in administering and interpreting QEEG analyses with patients.
- 4. Qualified with certifications from one or more relevant certification bodies, i.e.,
 - International QEEG Certification Board (IQCB)
 QEEG Diplomate certification or higher (QEEG-D/QEEG-DL)
 - The American Board of Clinical Neurophysiology (ABCN)
 Diplomate certification
- 5. Be familiar with the QEEG scientific literature.
- 6. Been an author in one or more QEEG scientific publications.
- 7. Must be capable of answering standard questions and provide counsel with the relevant discovery issues such as EEG recording procedures, test retest reliability, elimination of artifact, measures of focal sharp waves and brain deregulation, etc.
- 8. Ability to provide the EEG tracings of the original recording.
- 9. Ability to provide an explanation and documentation on the calibration methods for used to collect the EEG and the software used to process the data.
- 10. Ability to provide FDA status for instrumentation and software for use by a qualified person
- 11. Ability to explain that the QEEG is not to be used as a standalone diagnostic test for any clinical condition including for traumatic brain injury or schizophrenia.
